Upon disembarking on its pristine white sand beach, after two hours of sailing from the Itabaca Channel, you'll be stepping into a world of dramatic contrasts. We'll explore rugged lava formations, creating an otherworldly backdrop for our adventure. The landscape here is not just unique; it's breathtakingly beautiful, with a mix of rough lava flows and soft, inviting sands.

Get ready to encounter the playful Galapagos sea lions, who often grace the beaches of Chinese Hat. These friendly creatures highlight the island, offering up-close encounters in their natural habitat. And keep your eyes peeled for the marine iguanas basking in the sun – these prehistoric-looking creatures are a sight to behold.





Sometimes, if we're lucky, we might spot the majestic Galapagos hawk soaring overhead, a true symbol of the wild spirit of the Galapagos. The surrounding waters are also home to fascinating marine life, including a variety of fish, sharks, and occasionally rays and penguins.

Our journey then takes us on a Zodiac ride along the coast of nearby Santiago Island. Here, we have the chance to witness a few penguins, and with some luck, we might even see them darting playfully in the water.

The snorkeling experience near Santiago's coast is an underwater spectacle not to be missed. Immerse yourself in the clear waters to discover an array of colorful fish, sharks, and, occasionally, rays and penguins swimming alongside you.

Our itinerary begins with a Zodiac tour and a guided walk on the island, culminating in an exhilarating snorkeling experience.
